



How to keep the bamboo floorings in good condition?

A huge benefit of bamboo is its durability. It's just like wood flooring in that it needs to be properly maintained to ensure its longevity and quality. You have to protect your bamboo flooring from dents, scratches, warping and stains. We are now going to reveal some bamboo flooring tips on cleaning and maintenance works.

Preventative Measures

Asking people to remove their shoes when they enter the room will help to prevent scuff marks and scratches in the floor, and will cut down on the amount of small particle debris tracked through the room.

Keeping your pets nails trimmed is another way to help cut down on scratches in the floors surface. This is especially true of larger dogs that can cause relatively deep.

Heavy furniture should never be dragged across a bamboo floor. You should also put thick fabric or felt furniture pads under the legs of heavy pieces, so that they do not sink into the floor and cause divots. If the furnishing has casters they should either be removed or replaced with felt backed casters.


Sunlight can discolor certain types of bamboo. You can cut down on discoloration through the use of shades or blinds on places that are exposed to sunlight each day.

Although bamboo has a relatively higher water-resistance than hardwood, it is still a problem that should be addressed. Bamboo floorings will still be darkened or even expanded if consistently dealt with moist. In wet environments, place rugs or mats in front of high moisture areas such as in front of your bathroom and kitchen.

The color of a bamboo floor can fade slightly over time. By periodically rotating your furniture you can ensure that this fading happens evenly across the entire surface of the bamboo floor.

Regular Cleaning

Dust, sand, and other small particles represent the greatest threat to the surface beauty of a bamboo floor. These tiny grains act like the grits of a piece of sandpaper, and as people walk across the floor they will inadvertently press them down into the surface of the bamboo and or drag them across the finish, scarring and scratching it. In order to prevent scratching you should either sweep or vacuum a bamboo floor regularly. Do not allow the tiny abrasive materials to build up on its surface.

Rugs and mats can also be placed at any entrances to the room in order to cut down on the amount of small particle debris that comes into the space. These rugs should be dusted out regularly.

There are a number of cleaning products which are specifically designed for cleaning bamboo floors. You will also find that most hardwood floor cleansers are also appropriate for bamboo, provided that they are non-alkaline, and are not a wax.

A damp mop can be used to remove surface stains and pick up small debris. If you are using a bamboo floor cleaning product that requires mixing with water, make sure you follow all manufacturer instructions.

If liquid is spilled on the floor it needs to be wiped up immediately. Liquid can penetrate through bamboo surfaces, causing deep stains that will be almost impossible to remove. Excessive moisture will also cause warping in the wood.
